A. Food Preparation		
1. Hands are washed before food is prepared

B. Environment

9. Gate on stairs for mobile infant or toddler-both upstairs and downstairs*

11. Crib or playpen slats no more than 23/8 inches (width of a soda can) apart*		
12. Toys and objects small enough to be swallowed kept away from children*		
13. Provider can see infants and toddlers at all times		
14. Children are not left in play pens, swings, jumpers, strollers or other restraints for more than half of the observation period.		
15. Children do not use mobile walker		
16. Area used for child care has enough light to read by

C. Routines		
 Caregiver washes hands with soap and water after each diapering, when helping children with toileting, or when handling soiled clothing

4. Accessible place for children to wash hands (e.g., steps or stool near sink)
